The Care House Warehouse Endeavor

What an amazing journey we have been on these past two and a half years. It all started when Hubble Homes chose Care House Partnerships to be one of the recipients of their 2021 Hero House donations. This donation led to a season of dreaming and praying by the CHP Board of Directors, which lead to the dream of creating a 4,500 square foot facility to house our food bank. Such a facility has been the dream of our food bank director, Neal Moore, for years, and became a labor of love for Pastor Tony Johnson, CHP's Programs Director & COO. They worked with a Construction Development team, architects, design engineers, City of Nampa planners, and contractors to create a facility that will support the ministry we are currently providing through the Care House Food Bank, and have room for future growth. While challenging at times, God has worked to create a facility that will bless and benefit our community for years to come.

God has also faithfully provided the finances and partnerships needed to make this facility a reality. Thanks to the tremendous generosity of the Richard & Helen Percifield Estate, Hubble Homes, and The Harry Morrison Foundation, along with our partnerships with R&M Steel, ESI Construction, Gem State Steel Erectors, Nucor-Harris Rebar, Lee's Plumbing, Dan Friesen, as well as many gracious donors from Nampa First Church of the Nazarene and our community, we broke ground for construction in October of 2023. In November and December, concrete began to be poured for footings, stem walls, and the floor slab, and the new year started with the building being raised and enclosed. Wow! That all happened so fast!

Care House Partnerships wants to give a loud shout-out to our project 'general,' Bob Ecker and our project manager, Brian Howerton, for doing the 'work' to make this facility a reality. They have done a great job keeping the project moving forward, and Bob has tapped into the generosity of many contractors and suppliers, resulting in more gifts-in-kind towards the project.

CHP is so appreciative of the great volunteers who have come out to make this project move quickly towards completion - Mike Meyers, Lyle Borah, Steve Wynia, and Bob Boyd. Their experience and expertise has moved this dream to into a reality.



The Care House Clinic

I have been volunteering as a R.N. at the Care House Clinic since it opened to our medical patients in 2021. It started out slow as we got the word out, and now we are seeing on average 5 to 6 patients every other Monday evening. Our patients are individuals who are not able to get the medical care because they do not have medical insurance and their income constraints. I have seen time and time again their grateful hearts as they are finally able to find care for their many issues that have not been addressed for years. They are relieved and experience a sense of peace as they finally have their health concerns dealt with.

We have been truly blessed by these individuals as well as they share their gratefulness to us as we care for them. At times, God has literally brought them to our door seeking help. One evening, we encountered a family in crisis who was desperate for not only physical care but emotional care as well. They were not on the schedule, but we fit them in and they were beyond thankful for how we cared for them. You see, we form a bond with many of the patients we see on a regular basis, creating a sense of trust that encourages continual care for their chronic needs.

One thing that stands out to me is how many people, including me, take for granted having access to good medical care, and yet our patients don't have that privilege. They become overwhelmed with worry that what they are feeling might be cancer, diabetes, or hypertension. Thanks to donations and our partnerships, we are able to assist them for labs, diagnostic imaging, referrals to specialist at no cost to them. The Care House Clinic has truly become a place of refuge for many, and I'm honored to be a part of it. We are all entrusted and called to be healers and helpers to those that are less fortunate, filling a role given to them by God to be Jesus to the struggling.







Celebrate Recovery

My name is Phyllis, and I am a grateful believer in of Jesus who is in recovery for a 25+ year Meth addiction and is addressing my anger issues.

I grew up in an alcoholic home which never talked about God, church or religion. I spent most of my adult life using and selling drugs until October of 2012 when I was arrested. In June of 2013, the federal government moved into my life, changing me forever as I have been clean since July 8th, 2013. In 2019, I found myself in Idaho caring for my dying father. One day when I visited the Care House Food Bank, a lady told me about this awesome group called Celebrate Recovery. I came the following Tuesday and just like that, all I wanted was to develop a relationship with God.

I was in a chemical dependency small group on December 7th, 2021 when a dear friend lead me through the sinner's prayer and I accepted Jesus Christ as my Savior. I was baptized the following Easter and have been on this AMAZING spiritual journey ever since. Today, I recognize that God has always been in my life, even during all those violent times in my addiction. THANK YOU JESUS! God has shown me so much grace and mercy. I am so thankful that when I was lost, you found me. When I was ashamed, you forgave me, nailing my sins to the cross. I have learned to forgive others to forgive myself.

I have amazing relationships with my forever family at CR. I am in leadership, and I approach every newcomer with open arms and support. Each time I do a 12-step study, I realize that if I let go and let God lead me, he will not steer me wrong. I'm so thankful for all God has done to give me a new life.






Statement of Designated Funds






Care House Food Bank Numbers

People Served












